Commercial Design Categories

C01: Corporate – Large (> 15,000 SF)

C02: Corporate – Small (< 15,000 SF)

C03: Healthcare

[hospital, clinic, doctor's office, nursing home, asst. living facility, etc.]

C04: Hospitality

[hotel, resort, spa, vacation rental, restaurant, bar, country club, fitness center, etc.]

C05: Multi-Family

[living (model unit), facilities (sales center, amenities, etc.) or both]

C06: Retail

[salon, boutique, gallery, showroom, theater, dealership, etc.]

C07: Rated Space

[Building and/or interior that has earned at least one of the following ratings: WELL, LEED, Fitwel, Living Building Challenge.]

C08: Unique Space

C09: Emerging Professional^A

[Comprehensive project or singular space in any of the Commercial categories listed above.]

C10: Product Design/Special Detail

C11: Industry Partner Collaboration^B

R01: Entire Residence (> 5,000 SF)

R02: Entire Residence (< 5,000 SF)

R03: Model Home/Show Home

R04: Kitchen – New Construction

R05: Kitchen – Remodel

R06: Living Space – New Construction

R07: Living Space – Remodel

R08: Dining Room – New Construction

R09: Dining Room – Remodel

R10: Bathroom – New Construction

R11: Bathroom – Remodel

R12: Bedroom – New Construction

Additional Categories [Commercial or Residential Design]

AD01: Outdoor Living

AD02: Adaptive Reuse/Historic Preservation/Sustainable Design

[Comprehensive project or singular space that either: reuses an existing building and/or interior for a purpose other than which it was originally built or designed for; preserves the nature of an historic building and/or interior (minor modifications and systems upgrades to meet modern building requirements and codes acceptable); focuses on environmental friendly and/or energy efficient products, installation methods, and/or systems.]

AD03: Reclaimed Material/Renewed Item

[Interior feature constructed using reclaimed materials or object/product/antique item refurbished for reuse and/or repurposed for use other than which it was originally built or designed for.]

Student Design Categories

ST01: Commercial *[Theoretical comprehensive project or singular space for commercial use.]*

ST02: Residential *[Theoretical comprehensive project or singular space for residential use.]*

^AAn Emerging Professional (EP) is defined as someone who has earned their Interior Design degree within the last 5 years and is currently practicing interior design. The two EP categories can be either comprehensive projects or singular spaces.

^BThe two Industry Partner (IP) Collaboration categories must highlight a feature(s) or product(s) created by the designer but exclusively developed with the help of / in conjunction with an ASID IP and their specialized expertise and manufacturing capabilities. The ASID IP must be in good standing, and the ASID IP Representative must be named in the entry.
